We are currently seeking a compassionate and skilled Registered Nurse (RN) to provide foot care and wound care services as part of our interdisciplinary primary care team. This is a permanent part-time position of 22.5 hours per week supporting clients with complex health and social needs in both clinical and community-based settings.

About the Role

The Registered Nurse (RN) – Foot Care and Wound Care provides assessment, treatment, follow-up, education, and support to clients requiring foot care and wound care services. Working as part of an interdisciplinary team, this role supports clients who may be living with chronic disease, diabetes, vascular concerns, mental health and substance use challenges, poverty, trauma, and other barriers to care.

The role requires a strong commitment to client-centered, trauma-informed, culturally safer, and health equity-focused care. The successful candidate will work collaboratively with internal staff and external partners to support improved health outcomes, prevention, and access to care.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide foot care and wound care assessment, treatment, monitoring, and follow-up
- Develop and implement care plans for clients with wounds, pressure injuries, foot complications, and chronic disease-related risks
- Provide client education related to wound prevention, foot care, self-management, and health promotion
- Apply evidence-based wound care and foot care best practices and relevant clinical guidelines
- Support early identification and management of diabetes-related foot complications and other high-risk conditions
- Build respectful and trusting relationships with clients experiencing systemic barriers, trauma, mental health and substance use challenges, or complex health and social needs
- Work collaboratively within an interdisciplinary team and with community partners
- Support healthcare system navigation, referrals, and care coordination as appropriate
- Maintain accurate and timely clinical documentation in the electronic medical record
- Participate in team meetings, case reviews, quality improvement, and organizational initiatives

- Contribute to a welcoming, non-judgmental, and safe environment for clients and colleagues

Qualifications

- Current registration and good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario
- Registered Nurse (RN) designation
- Experience in foot care and wound care, or strong interest and willingness to develop in this area
- Advanced foot care training is an asset; CCHC is willing to support and pay for required foot care training for the successful candidate
- Demonstrated experience in community health, primary care, outreach, or related setting
- Experience in wound care assessment, treatment planning, and follow-up
- Experience working with older adults/seniors
- Training and/or experience in diabetic foot care is an asset
- Experience working with individuals experiencing mental health and substance use challenges
- Knowledge of evidence-based wound care practices, including RNAO Best Practice Guidelines and other applicable standards
- Strong clinical assessment and judgment related to wound care, pressure injury prevention, and diabetes-related foot complications
- Experience working with vulnerable, marginalized, and underserved populations
- Demonstrated commitment to trauma-informed, client-centered, and culturally safer care
- Strong communication, organizational, time management, and interpersonal skills
- Experience using electronic medical records and Microsoft Office applications including Word, Excel, and Outlook
- Ability and willingness to maintain and update knowledge through courses, workshops, conferences, and technology-based learning opportunities
- Valid G driver's licence and ability to travel locally is preferred
