We are currently seeking a Nurse Practitioner for a permanent part-time position of 22.5 hours per week to support our Chronic Disease Management 65+ care stream. This role is ideal for a collaborative and compassionate clinician committed to supporting older adults through holistic primary care, chronic disease management, health promotion, and prevention. At CCHC, Nurse Practitioners are supported to work to their full scope of practice as valued members of an interdisciplinary primary care team.

About the Role

The Nurse Practitioner (NP) provides primary care services to individuals and families, emphasizing a holistic approach to chronic disease management, health promotion, disease prevention, support, and treatment. Within the 65+ care stream, this role focuses on supporting older adults with chronic and complex conditions through comprehensive assessment, diagnosis, treatment, education, counselling, follow-up, and coordination of care.

Working as part of an interdisciplinary team, the NP participates in the development, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs and services for individuals, families, and the community. The role may involve care delivery in the clinic, in community outreach locations, and through home visits, as appropriate. CCHC supports Nurse Practitioners in practicing to their full legislated scope in order to provide responsive, accessible, and high-quality care.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide primary health care services within the scope of the RN(EC), including physical assessment, diagnosis, treatment, ordering and interpretation of tests, therapeutics, health promotion, education, counselling, screening, referral, and follow-up
- Provide holistic, client-centred care to older adults with chronic and complex health conditions
- Support chronic disease management with a focus on prevention, early intervention, education, and ongoing monitoring

- Consult with physicians and other health care providers when client needs extend beyond NP scope of practice
- Deliver care in a variety of settings, including the clinic, community outreach locations, and home visits, as appropriate
- Work within a health care framework that emphasizes health promotion, disease prevention, and recognition of the social, physical, and psychological factors that affect health
- Work collaboratively with members of the interdisciplinary team to plan, provide, and coordinate care
- Maintain complete and accurate clinical documentation and participate in chart reviews and case discussions
- Contribute to program development, delivery, monitoring, and evaluation
- Collect statistical and clinical data as required and participate in quality improvement and organizational initiatives
- Participate in staff meetings, team meetings, committees, and community/service partnerships as needed
- Maintain professional competence through ongoing continuing education and professional development
- Support and precept NP students, where appropriate

Qualifications

- Undergraduate degree in Nursing from a recognized university
- Holds a Nurse Practitioner – Primary Health Care certificate from the College of Nurses of Ontario
- Current registration in the Extended Class with the College of Nurses of Ontario
- Minimum three years' experience in a community health setting, or a combination of community, hospital, or public health settings
- Experience in program development, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation
- Demonstrated experience or strong interest in chronic disease management and care of older adults / seniors
- Experience working within an interdisciplinary primary care team
- Knowledge of health promotion, disease prevention, and the social determinants of health
- Strong clinical assessment, communication, interpersonal, and organizational skills
- Proficiency in the use of computers and various software applications, including electronic medical records and Microsoft Office
- Confidence working in a fast-paced environment and responding positively to demanding issues while maintaining a welcoming and professional approach
- Experience in mental health is an asset
- Valid Ontario driver's licence
